

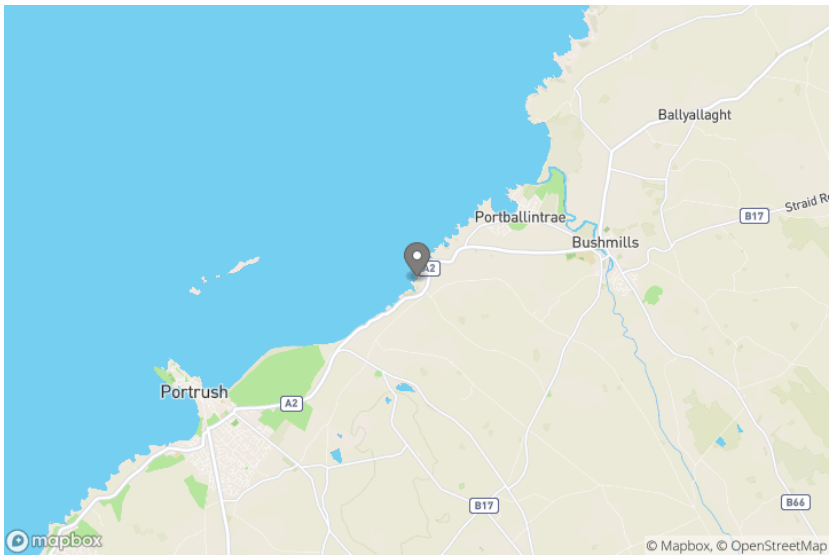
# Northern Ireland - Dunluce Castle
