

# Sunset from Mount Qingcheng



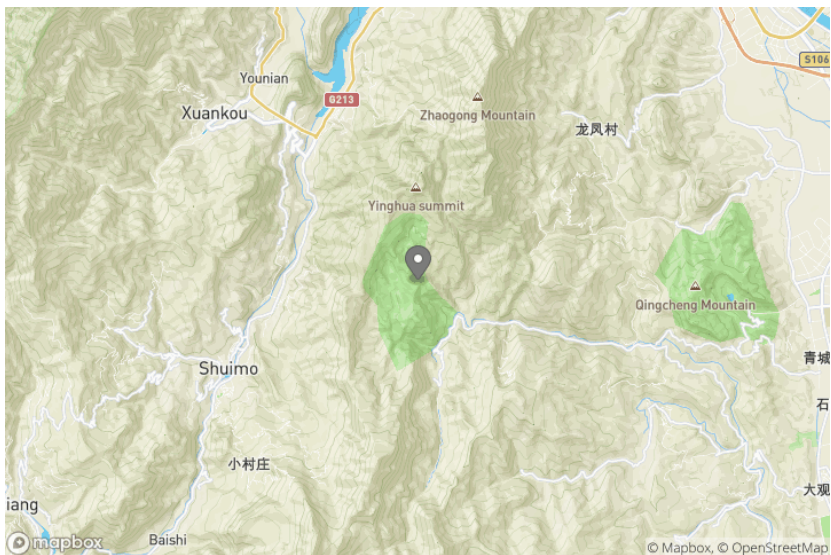
